

Privacy Policy

By using this site or / and our services, you consent to the Processing of Personal Data as described in this Privacy Policy.

Definitions

Personal Data is any information relating to an identified or identifiable natural person. Processing any operation or set of operations which is performed on Personal Data or on sets of Personal Data. Data Subject is a natural person whose Personal Data is being Processed. Child is a natural person under 16 years of age. We/us (either capitalized or not) DDM

Data Protection Principles

We promise to follow the following Data Protection principles:

We process data in a lawful, fair and transparent manner.

We have lawful grounds for processing data.

We consider your rights before, while and after processing personal data.

We can provide you with information regarding our data processing upon request.

We keep data processing to a minimum. We process only as much data as is required.

We process data only for the intended use. We don't have a hidden agenda with regards to gathering data. For instance, if you contact us through our contact page, we don't send your data to a third party.

We place a time limit on stored data. We won't store your data for longer than needed.

We try to keep your data up to date, while it is in our safekeeping.

We try to ensure that your data is safe and kept confidential at all times while it is in our hands.

Data Subject's rights

The Data Subject has the following rights:

Right to information - You have the right to know whether your Personal Data is being processed; what Personal Data is gathered, from where it is obtained and why and by whom it is processed.

Right to access - You have the right to access Personal Data collected from / about you. This includes your right to request and obtain a copy of your Personal Data gathered.

Right to rectification - You have the right to request rectification or erasure of your Personal Data if it's inaccurate or incomplete.

Right to erasure - Under certain circumstances you may request your Personal Data be erased from our records.

Right to restrict processing - Where certain conditions apply, you have the right to restrict the Processing of your Personal Data.

Right to object to processing - In certain cases you have the right to object to Processing of your Personal Data, for example in the case of direct marketing.

Right to object to automated Processing - You have the right to object to automated Processing, including profiling; and not to be subject to a decision based solely on automated Processing. This right you can exercise whenever there is an outcome of the profiling that produces legal effects concerning or significantly affecting you.

Right to data portability - You have the right to obtain your Personal Data in a machine-readable format or if it is feasible, as a direct transfer from one Processor to another.

Right to lodge a complaint - In the event that we refuse your request under the Rights of Access, we will provide you with a reason as to why. If you are not satisfied with the way your request has been handled, please contact us. Contact details are at the bottom of this page.

Right for the help of supervisory authority - You have the right for the help of a supervisory authority and the right for other legal remedies such as claiming damages.

Right to withdraw consent - You have the right to withdraw any given consent for Processing of your Personal Data.

What happens with Personal Data

This is what happens with Personal Data submitted to DDM.

General contact form

In the event Personal Data is added to a general contact form and sent, that Personal Data is emailed to the managers of the website.

The submitter of the form consents to have their Personal Data stored in DDM's database, access of which is limited to website managers.

Newsletter signup form

In the event Personal Data is added to a newsletter signup form, that Personal Data may be sent to a newsletter provider used by DDM. This is either Mailchimp or MailerLite.

The sign up triggers an email, which is sent to a manager to inform us of a sign up. Personal Data (name, email address) submitted to the newsletter signup form is added to our newsletter provider's database, from where we use it to send consensual emails.

Comments form

In the event Personal Data is added as a comment on DDM, that Personal Data (name, email address; IP address) is stored in DDM's database, for the purpose of displaying a commenter's comment. If social media commenting is active, you may sign in and comment with your social media account, but DDM or its managers don't have access to these details.

Online purchases

In the event a product is purchased on ddrighnow.org, Personal Data (name, email address, IP address, phone number, physical address, postal address, product preferences, credit card details or debit card details) is sent to a payment processor (such as PayPal, Skrill or Amazon Pay) for the processing of a payment for goods ordered.

Personal Data (name, email address, IP address, phone number, physical address, postal address, product preferences) is also sent to a fulfillment and logistics company for shipping product/s to the person who placed the order.

Personal Data we collect

This section covers which Personal Data we collect.

When ordering or registering on our site, as appropriate, you may be asked to enter Personal Data. You may, however, visit our site anonymously.

Data from our partners

We don't have partners that receive Personal Data at this time.

Publicly available Data

We might gather Personal Data about you that is publicly available, like your IP address.

How we use Personal Data

We use Personal Data on legitimate grounds and / or with your Consent.

On the grounds of entering into a contract or fulfilling contractual obligations, we Process Personal Data for the following purposes:

If you've purchased something from ddrighnow.org, you give us Personal Data (name, email address, phone number, physical address) to process and send your order.

On the ground of legitimate interest, we Process Personal Data for the following purposes:

If you contact us through a contact form, we use your Personal Data to reply to your query.

If you leave a comment, we display your comment and your name on ddrighnow.org (without revealing your email address), and we may use your Personal Data to contact you with regards to your comment.

If you sign up for our newsletter, we use your Personal Data to send you newsletters of interest to you.

As long as you have not informed us otherwise, we consider offering you products / services that are similar or same to your purchasing history / browsing behaviour to be our legitimate interest.

By using DDM, our analytics providers (Google Analytics) receive the following Personal Data:

Your IP address

Your browser

Your operating system

We Process Personal Data in order to fulfil obligations arising from law and / or use Personal Data for options provided by law. We reserve the right to anonymise Personal Data gathered and to use any such data. We will use data outside the scope of this Policy only when it is anonymised. We save your billing information and other Personal Data gathered about you for as long as needed for accounting purposes or other obligations deriving from law, but no longer than 5 years.

We might process Personal Data for additional purposes that are not mentioned here, but are compatible with the original purpose for which the data was gathered. To do this, we will ensure that:

the link between purposes, context and nature of Personal Data is suitable for further Processing;
the further Processing would not harm your interests and
there would be appropriate safeguard for Processing.

We will inform you of any further Processing and purposes.

Who else can access Personal Data?

We don't share Personal Data with strangers.

We do not sell, trade, or otherwise transfer Personal Data to outside parties. This does not include trusted third parties who assist us in operating our website, conducting our business, or providing the services that you ask us to arrange on your behalf, so long as those parties agree to keep your Personal Data confidential. We may also release your information when we believe release is appropriate to comply with the law, enforce our site policies, or protect ours or others' rights, property, or safety. However, non-personally identifiable visitor information may be provided to other parties for marketing, advertising, or other uses.

Members signing up to DDM services that we provide share Personal Data or company information with other members. However, this information is shared only when we receive a declaration from you advising us that you wish this information to be shared on these platforms.

We only work with Processing partners who offer a sufficient level of protection of Personal Data.

We disclose Personal Data to third parties or public officials when legally obliged to do so.

If you've given consent, we might disclose Personal Data to third parties, or on legal grounds.

If we provide trusted partners with Personal Data, it's to make the provision of our service/s to you possible or to enhance your experience on DDM.

Our processing partners

Ecwid - an ecommerce plugin used for selling products on our website.

Google Forms - a plugin used for creating forms, including contact forms and sign up forms.

Our business partners

We do not currently have any business partners offering a service on or through this site.

Connected third parties

WordPress Jetpack. Used for enhancing the functionality of a WordPress website. Google Analytics. Uses your IP address for analytics purposes. YouTube. Uses your IP for location purposes. (They may decide to block a video from playing in your location, based on your IP address.)

How we secure Personal Data

We do our best to keep Personal Data safe. We use safe protocols for communication and transferring data (such as HTTPS). We use anonymising and pseudonymising where suitable. We monitor our systems for possible vulnerabilities and attacks. We rely on software to help thwart brute force login attacks.

Where third party payment processing is accessed via our website, all supplied sensitive / credit information is transmitted via Secure Socket Layer (SSL) technology and then encrypted into our payment gateway provider's database only to be accessible by those authorised with special access rights to such systems, and who are contractually required to keep the information confidential.

After a transaction, your private information (credit card numbers, name and address details, etc.) will not be stored on our servers. We do not store customer credit card details.

We take every reasonable action to prevent security breaches and to assist authorities if a breach occurs.

Even though we try our best we can not guarantee the security of information.

However, in the unlikely event of a data breach, we shall notify the appropriate authorities about it.

We shall also notify Data Subjects if a breach occurs.

If you have an account with us, note that you have to keep your username and password secret.
